What is the Befriending Service

The Befriending Service

Supports older people living independently in their own homes. Its primary aim is to reduce rural and social isolation and keep people in touch with their local community.

How the Befriending Service works

Our Befriending Coordinator will organise a home visit to have a chat about the service, and discuss your needs and requirements.

The next step is to carefully match a befriender volunteer who can offer opportunities for 1 to 1 befriending support in or out of the home.

What the Befriending Service offers:

Home Visiting

A home visiting service is available for clients who prefer a volunteer to visit them in their own home for one to one friendship.

This can be as regular as a weekly visit or when required by the client.

Social Support

Volunteers can also support clients to go out of their home, by taking them for a coffee and a chat, to take books back to the library, do some shopping or have a day out, our aim is to help and enhance the lives of individuals who are living independently.

Referrals to the scheme can be made directly from an individual, family member, friend or carer.

We also receive referrals from other voluntary organisations or statutory organisations such as social services, community nurses, GPs, house wardens or health visitors.

All our volunteers are trained and go through the full Disclosure and Barring Service checks.

We work in partnership with Stokesley CCA, Thirsk CCA and also Northallerton Community Action to provide the scheme across Hambleton district and the scheme is funded by North Yorkshire County Council.
